# • Daughter's Day – September 24<sup>th</sup> at City Hall

Daughter's Day is a community initiative that highlights the importance of our daughters as well as the importance of women in every aspect of life in Alberta. The theme for 2022 was: A New Horizon to Build a Better Future! There were 6 women, called Daughters of the Year, recognized on September 24<sup>th</sup>, 2022 at City Hall, including Chantelle Cluett-Alstad, Delmy Garcia-Hoyt, Tonia LaRiviere, Laura Murphy, Jayanti Negi, and Mercedes Messinger. They were all truly inspiring.

ICWA successfully nominated Jayanti Negi for the Daughter of the Year Award. Jayanti Negi saw a need in the community forty years ago and filled it, by helping newcomer women to overcome challenges they faced in their new country. In 1984, Jayanti and a group of newcomers from the Indian sub-continent founded the Indo-Canadian Women's Association (ICWA), and she became its first Executive Director. Among the ICWA's first programs, she created a homework club to assist immigrant children deal with school and help with language barriers. She created a "Saheli" (female friends) program to bring single senior immigrants together to reduce isolation and provide a forum where they could discuss common problems. Other programs under her leadership included: conferences to support the human rights of women, a settlement program for newcomers, and the development of partnerships which helped establish the Millwoods Welcome Centre for Immigrants. Jayanti retired from her position with ICWA in 2001, leaving ICWA as a major support organization in Edmonton.

## • Indigenous People's Experience – Feb 15, 2023, at Fort Edmonton Park

The goal of the Indo-Canadian Women's Association February event was aimed to create a cultural and knowledge of Alberta's Indigenous People. The City of Edmonton sponsored this event, and it was successful as there were over 100 women, men, and children in attendance. This initiative was designed to build bridges and understanding between cultures for the creation of an inclusive City.

The day started with most of the participants heading on a bus from Millwoods to Fort Edmonton Park. Each person was able to have 3-hours of exclusive access to the Indigenous People's Experience. It was followed by an hour-long facilitated Reconciliation presentation and discussion. Participants received a pocket-sized copy of the Truth and Reconciliation Commission (TRC) Calls for Action Booklet produced by the National Centre for Truth and Reconciliation and Bannock treats were also provided.

The educational experience is just the beginning for the South Asian community to understand and empathize with the indigenous population, including the importance of responding to the Calls to Action. ICWA looks forward to hosting future events for the community to learn about Canada and grow in knowledge and education.



# **ICWA Projects**

# • Backpack Program funded by the Edmonton South Rotary

In August 2022, the students, together with the Program Coordinator, distributed backpacks for children in need with a generous donation from Edmonton South Rotary. 48 children received Backpacks and gift cards from this program. The pencils were supplied by Rod Loyola, MLA. Many of the recipients were newcomers to Edmonton from different countries, including Ukraine.

• Project CASA (Culturally Appropriate & Safe Assistance through home visitation for survivors of violence) Funder: Women and Gender Equality (WAGE), Government of Canada.

Project CASA (2019-2023): Culturally Appropriate and Safe Assistance through Home Visitation for Survivors of Violence. The Funder was Women and Gender Equality (WAGE), Government of Canada. Province-wide training took place focused on "Cultural Safety" to promote the delivery of culturally safe home visitation and support of multicultural at-risk mothers. This project concluded in April 2023.

Cultural safety is a crucial aspect of home visitation programs because it ensures that families from diverse cultural backgrounds feel respected and understood. When home visitors are culturally safe, they can establish trust and rapport with families, which is essential for effective communication and positive outcomes. By recognizing and addressing cultural differences, home visitors can better understand the unique needs and strengths of each family they work with. This can lead to increased engagement, better health outcomes, and a more positive experience for families. Overall, promoting cultural safety in home visitation programs is vital for building strong and trusting relationships with families and creating a more inclusive and equitable society.

Thanks to the many organizations that have been instrumental in proceeding with this project, especially the Alberta Home Visitation Network Association (AHVNA). **Partners:** Indo-Canadian Women's Association (Lead) **with AHVNA**, Multicultural Health Brokers Co-op, Edmonton Mennonite Centre for Newcomers, Institute for the Advancement of Aboriginal Women, Government of Alberta (Family Violence Unit, Children's Services – Edmonton Region), and many others too numerous to mention.

## • Family Law Guidebook for Recent Immigrants- second edition

The publication of the Family Law Guidebook was funded by a grant from the Canadian Women's Foundation. The second edition of the Guidebook was updated by lawyers Shilpa Jaswal and Harshdeep Jakhar, and it was professionally edited and fact-checked in English and Hindi. ## • Neighborhood Equity for Aging in Racialized Communities (NEARc)

Since March 2023, ICWA has been working with the University of Alberta to engage women living in South Edmonton who are 60 years and over, and who speak Urdu, Punjabi, or Hindi to become part of this Walkability Study. This study aims to promote outdoor mobility and enhance neighbourhood walkability for racialized older immigrant women in Edmonton. We are currently in Phase A of the project whereby the women are being interviewed and data is being collected by the University of Alberta students and researchers. Phase A will conclude in October 2023.

# **ICWA Programs**

• Creating Safer Communities – Funded by the Canadian Women's Foundation

Creating Safer Communities was funded from April 2022 until March 2023. This project provided individualized support and appointments to the survivors of gender-based and family violence through phone calls, referrals, and informational workshops.

## • ECALA (Edmonton Community Adult Learning Association) funded Program

The ECALA program served a total of 133 clients last year, through the ESL Functional Literacy, Seniors Conversation Circles, and Digital Skills Facilitation classes. To make it easier for the learners to attend, a lot of our classes were facilitated remotely via Zoom. In 2022-2023 there was a hybrid model of service delivery.

#### • Kitab Connections (Book Club) – Funded by the Edmonton Community Foundation

A 6-month facilitated specialized book club called Kitab Connections (Kitab means book in Hindi/Urdu). Immigrant women in south Edmonton are engaged to read and discuss books on the immigrant experience with a facilitator's guidance. This program runs from May 2022 – November 2022. The benefits of this Program include creative engagement, connections, recovery and respite from isolation and stress.

# • Pro-Bono Law Clinic – Funded by the Canadian Women's Foundation

The Canadian Women's Foundation and its partners have generously funded this project until March 2023. This Program is still being provided by a generous lawyer who is dedicating her time to helping women in need suffering from domestic violence issues. A lawyer is available biweekly, for a one-time, free and confidential consultation for women about matters related to gender-based violence and family law. Appointments can be made by calling: 780-490-0477.

## • Service Canada Summer Jobs Students Program

ICWA received funding from Service Canada to hire two summer students. We offered various virtual workshops on diverse topics, particularly through the youth leadership program.

Our workshops and information sessions were targeted to the youth and covered a variety of topics including a Wellness Workshop, job preparation skills, resume writing, budgeting and managing money, and pottery painting.

## Steps to Empowerment – Funded by HelpAge Canada

This Program provided individualized support to isolated South Asian seniors in Edmonton. The purpose was to increase awareness of recently immigrated women and men by connecting them with appropriate community resources, facilitating participation and in-person wellness and educational activities.

There was a weekly session of fun, wellness and information for the seniors from July to November 2022. In total 70 unique seniors participated in different sessions, and we received positive feedback from clients. Thanks as well for the funding received by the Edmonton Public Teachers and the Yoga Association of Alberta for providing for the yoga teachers.
